Arima Man, 37, in Court for \$35,000 Car Fraud

A 37-year-old Arima man who was charged with Obtaining \$35,000 by False Pretenses was granted \$55,000 bail with a surety on Thursday by a Justice of the Peace.

LINDSAY WHISKEY, **of Pinto, Arima**, was arrested and charged on September 22nd by PC Quasie Thomas of the Fraud Squad.

The accused is expected to appear before a Port-of-Spain Magistrate on October 21st, 2022 to answer the charge.

According to a police report, on March 11th, 2017, a man allegedly paid a male suspect \$35,000 which represented full payment for the purchase of a Toyota Corolla motor vehicle after he was led to believe that the vehicle was free from all encumbrances.

However, it was learnt that the vehicle was subject to a loan facility and was repossessed.

Police were told efforts made by the buyer to get a refund from the suspect proved futile.

A report subsequently made to the Fraud Squad and a team of officers led by Insp Smith and PC Mohammed conducted further investigations. The suspect was then arrested and charged with the offence.
