Firearm, Ammunition and Cannabis Seized in Western and South Western Divisions

Police seized firearms, ammunition, and destroyed a quantity of cannabis plants during anti-crime exercises conducted in the Western and South Western Divisions yesterday.

Between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Thursday 6th November, 2025, officers conducted an Operation Trident exercise in the Diego Martin District of the Western Division. Acting on intelligence that foreign nationals were cultivating cannabis plants in the area, officers proceeded to a garden located in the hills at Upper Good Session Drive, Patna Village, Diego Martin.

Upon arrival, officers observed approximately 200 cannabis plants, which were subsequently uprooted and destroyed. During the operation, officers also discovered a wooden and galvanized structure nearby. A search of the area led to the seizure of one Remington 870 Magnum shotgun, one 12-gauge cartridge, one magazine containing 12 rounds of 5.56mm ammunition, and one green camouflage jacket.

WPC Jackson is continuing enquiries into this matter.

The operation was supervised by Senior Superintendent Williams, coordinated by Inspector Grant, and led by Ag/Sgt Dominique.

In a separate exercise, officers of the South Western Division responded to a report of two suspicious persons wearing ski masks in the vicinity of a mini mart along S.S. Erin Road, Palo Seco. Around 3:37 p.m., Sgt Gunness, along with W/Cpl Philandez, PC Jagoo, and PC Collins, arrived at the scene and conducted extensive checks in the surrounding area.

The officers discovered an abandoned ply structure located in a bushy area off S.T.O.L. Road, Palo Seco. Upon searching the structure, they found and seized one 12-gauge cartridge and two firearms concealed beneath clothing.
