36 Speeding Tickets Issued, TTPS Renews Warning to Drivers

The Trinidad and Tobago Police Service (TTPS) is once again warning motorists to reduce their speed, following multiple instances of excessive speeding recorded during the Easter holiday weekend.

On Sunday 20th April, 2025, the TTPS conducted speed enforcement exercises along the Churchill Roosevelt Highway. Officers from the Motorcycle Section and Road Safety Unit (RSU) were deployed in key areas.

During one operation near Wallerfield, 11 electronic tickets were issued for excess speed, with the highest recorded at 136 km/h. In a separate exercise in the El Socorro, 25 tickets were issued, with a top speed of 165 km/h recorded.

The TTPS is concerned by the continued disregard for speed limits. Excessive speed remains a leading contributor to road traffic collisions and fatalities.

The public is reminded that speeding endangers lives, and law enforcement will continue to maintain high visibility and enforce road safety regulations throughout the country. The TTPS urges all drivers to act responsibly and prioritize safety on the nation's roads.

Slow down. Obey the speed limits. Save lives-including your own.
