Stolen Vehicle Recovered, Suspect Detained in North-Central Operation

A stolen vehicle has been successfully recovered and a suspect detained following an intelligence-led operation conducted by the Stolen Vehicles Squad of the North-Central Division on the evening of Friday, October 3rd, 2025.

The operation, conducted between 6:15 p.m. and 10:35 p.m., was spearheaded by Senior Superintendent Maharaj, Superintendent Pariman, and Assistant Superintendent Narine, and directly supervised by Inspector Lazarus. The team also included Cpl's Mulrain and Villafana, WPCs Hosein and Darius, and PCs Wilson and Hall.

Based on surveillance and intelligence gathered over the past two weeks, officers proceeded to Palm Avenue, Casselton Avenue, Cane Farm, Trincity, where they discovered a grey Nissan Note, parked along the roadway.

Further investigations were conducted from the police records which revealed that the vehicle was reported stolen during a Robbery with Violence incident which occurred on Saturday, July 20th, 2025, in Bon Air Gardens, Arouca.

At the location, officers observed a male individual matching the suspect's description standing near the vehicle. The suspect, a 17-year-old male of Poinsettia Extension, Coconut Drive, Morvant, was approached, interviewed, and subsequently handed over the keys to the vehicle. He was arrested and cautioned in relation to the robbery.

The vehicle was photographed by WPC Vierul Shah of the Crime Scene Unit and later transported to the Arouca Police Station for further processing.

The suspect was also taken to the Arouca Police Station. Cpl Bristol of the Arouca CID is continuing investigations.
